The Kenan Advantage Group to Outfit Fleet with Oil Purification Systems' OPS-1 Oil Refiner System Shelton, CT, October 03, 2006

North America's Largest Independent Fuels Delivery Carrier Rolls Out Product on New 2006 Fleet for First Phase of Implementation

Shelton, Conn. - October 3, 2006 - Oil Purification Systems (www.ops-1.com), developer and manufacturer of the OPS-1 on-board oil refiner system, today announced that The Kenan Advantage Group, (www.thekag.com), the largest independent fuels delivery carrier in North America, is outfitting its fleet with the OPS-1 system, beginning with installation on all new 2006 vehicles. The OPS-1 system will significantly extend vehicle oil change intervals, enabling Kenan to reduce its oil-related costs by approximately 60 percent.

"Making the decision to outfit all of our new vehicles with the OPS-1 system was an easy one," said R.J. Molder, vice president of fleet services at Kenan. "We were able to perform a very thorough evaluation, including oil analyses, in only about three months. When our research showed us how substantial our savings would be, and we reviewed the list of OPS customers who are already experiencing similar results, we knew we couldn't afford to wait." Molder continued, "Improving margins by finding efficiencies is key to our success, so we move aggressively when technology of this magnitude comes along."

The Kenan Advantage Group chose the OPS-1 system after completing a successful evaluation on vehicles in its Canton, Ohio and Tampa, Fla. locations. Kenan performed oil analyses on four vehicles after 25,000 mile intervals. In all cases, oil samples came back "clean" at each interval. When the lab results showed that the vehicles still did not need oil changes at 50,000 miles, the company quickly made the decision to roll out the product on the newest vehicles in the fleet. Kenan has begun an aggressive program to outfit its fleet of 2,000 trucks with OPS-1 units. For the first phase of implementation, the company is installing the OPS-1 system on its new 2006 vehicles at the factory or dealership.

Mitchell Weseley, president and CEO of Oil Purification Systems said, "The Kenan Advantage Group is a recognized industry leader with a reputation for seeking out innovative technologies that support business growth. We are pleased that Kenan has identified the OPS-1 system for the operating efficiencies that it delivers, and ultimately its direct contribution to improving the bottom line."

The OPS-1 is an on-board oil refiner system that can be easily mounted on a broad range of vehicle and industrial engines. By removing the solid and liquid contaminants from engine oil, the OPS-1 virtually eliminates the need for oil changes. The OPS-1 is used by hundreds of fleets on thousands of vehicles and generators in trucking, busing, construction, mining and many other applications. Weighing only 11 pounds, the OPS-1 is a compact, two-piece system that can be split up for easy installation on the engine.
